1. Around the world, seasons and the weather are different.
2. Why is this?
3. Why are there two seasons in some countries—
4. a dry season and a rainy season—
5. but four seasons in others—
6. summer, autumn, winter and spring?
7. This red line is the equator.
8. Above and below the equator are two zones:
9. The Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn.
10. Countries that are on the equator or in these two zones have hot weather.
11. Parts of Kenya are on the equator.
12. They have two seasons.
13. It is hot all year round, but it rains from April to June and October to December.
14. Egypt is in the Tropic of Cancer.
15. The wet season is from December to April.
16. Above and below the tropics, the weather is different.
17. In this video, we're going to look at seasons in the United States and Canada.
18. Spring in the United States and Canada is from March to May.
19. The weather is warm and wet.
20. In Alaska, the rainfall is over 400 centimeters a year, but in Arizona it is only eight centimeters a year.
21. There's a lot of rain and sun.
22. Plants and flowers grow at this time.
23. After spring comes summer.
24. The summer months are June, July and August.
25. It is hot and sunny.
26. There's no school in the summer, so children play outside.
27. You can sometimes see storms in the summer, but usually there are blue skies.
28. In summer, the plants and trees have lots of green leaves, and fruit and vegetables grow.
29. Autumn is between September and November.
30. The weather is cold and it can be misty in the morning and evening.
31. Many people like the autumn because the leaves on the trees change color and fall.
32. It can be very beautiful.
33. Winter is from December to February.
34. Winter is cold and there can be a lot of snow.
35. It can be as cold as minus 60 degrees Celsius.
36. You can see snow in the cities and in the country.
37. Snow can be dangerous for cars, but children like it, and many people go skiing.
38. Some people hate the cold weather.
39. They travel south to the tropics for the sun and hot weather.
