With all verbs except *be*, *do* and *have*, add *s* to the end of the base form to make the simple present third person singular.

I **know** the answer. (Simple present tense using base form)

I **knew** the answer. (Simple past tense using past tense form).

I have **known** the answer since yesterday.

The answer was **known**.

He is a well-**known** writer.

He should/could/would/might have **known** the answer.

(The past participle appears in many ways—in the past, present and future perfect, in the passive voice, as adjectives, and in past modal verb structures.)
