As you develop a general knowledge of what happened and when it happened, you will begin to understand how events in this table influenced each other. For example, the banking and trading practices of Italian city-states in the 15th century financed the art of the Renaissance and the voyages of explorers who sailed to America and India. The printing press led to the Protestant Reformation and the Enlightenment. The industrial revolution was possible because of the steam engine and the wealth created by slavery, but the rise of machine labor was then a factor in the abolition of slavery. Technological advances in the 20th century made war much more violent than it used to be. Television and internet technology led to greater public awareness of international events and war.
